MNA Board Elections:


- ♦ MNA Board positions consist of the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and 15 Area Representatives and 2 At-Large Reps
- Board members are elected for one year terms and may be re-elected.
- ◆ Officers and At-Large Representatives are elected by majority vote of the MNA membership.
- ◆ Area Representatives are elected by majority vote of members from each corresponding Area.
- ♦ All MNA members over 18 years of age are eligible to run for any Board position, with priority given to candidates from each Area.

- ◆ To be included on the ballot, nominations should be submitted to Sally Stix at 271-7609 or sastix@tds.net by June 20. The ballots will also have a write-in option for each position at the time of the election.

FYI, here's a sampling of some of the MNA's accomplishments over the past year:

- ♦ We are finally officially a non-profit organization. That means, among other things, that donations to the MNA are now tax deductible, which will make us more competitive in applying for grants for community projects.
- We received a city grant to help finance our monthly community supper programs.
- ♦ We have been active partners with other local groups and organizations working to ensure the safety and well-being of all Meadowood residents, and to bridge the painful racial and economic divides that continue to plague us.
- ♦ We will sponsor treatment for 2 ash trees in Meadowood Park to save them from being cut down due to the ash borer epidemic.
- ♦ We again sponsored a pizza and mini golf party at Vitense, and our popular annual bingo party at the Knights of Columbus.
- We were recently awarded a "Citizen Assistance Citation" by Police Chief Koval for our support of a new midtown police station.
- We're sponsoring a "Make Music Madison" event in Meadowood Park. See the article on p. 3 of this newsletter.



Are you ready to vote in 2016? League of Women Voters of Dane County

Voter ID is now required.

In the election on April 5th, 123 voters in the city of Madison were given provisional ballots because they did not have an acceptable voter photo ID on Election Day. Only 41 of those voters provided a photo ID in time for their votes to be counted. Don't let this happen to you. Be sure you are ready to vote in the upcoming elections on August 9 and November 8, 2016.

If your address has changed since you last voted, you will need to register to vote at your new address. You can register at your municipal clerk's office, with a Special Registration Deputy, or, if a Madison resident, at any Madison Public Library. Beginning 20 days prior to an election you can only register at the clerk's office or at the polls on Election Day. Registering early will save time on Election Day. You will need to show proof of residence when you register.

Voters are now required to show a photo ID when voting. You can use a US Passport, a Wisconsin driver license (DL), or a Wisconsin state ID card with expiration dates after November 4, 2014. You can also use a Veteran Affairs card that is unexpired or has no expiration date. If there is an address on your photo ID, it does not have to be current. Out-of-state IDs are not acceptable. For a complete list of acceptable photo IDs, go to http://bringit.wi.gov/do-i-have-right-photo-id. If you don't have a Wisconsin DL or ID you can get a free ID at the Division of Motor Vehicle offices (4802 Sheboygan Avenue or 2001 Bartillon Drive in Madison). You will need to bring:

- Proof of citizenship, name and date of birth
 If you don't have all the proof you need, DMV will help verify
 your information.
- Proof of Wisconsin residency
- Proof of identity
- Your Social Security number

Note: If you have a driver's license or ID from another state you will have to give it up to obtain a Wisconsin ID. Seniors and people with disabilities who vote by *permanent* absentee ballot are exempt from the voter photo ID requirement. For more information see http://bringit.wisconsin.gov/are-there-exceptions-new-law.

Fall elections (Partisan Primary and General Election) are August 9 and November 8, 2016. Talk to your friends and neighbors. Make sure every eligible Wisconsin voter has the documentation needed to vote!



Meadowood Area Neighbors Assist Police in Thwarting Burglaries

Hi everyone! My name is Dave Glomp, one of the two Co-Police Liaisons for the Meadowood Neighborhood. My fellow Police Liaison, Merle Bengston, and I have been reporting on crime incidents throughout Meadowood and nearby neighborhoods on the Nextdoor Meadowood website for over two years. I am very pleased to report that, due in large part to the participation and cooperation of area neighbors and the police, a significant drop in crime has occurred, especially in the category of residential break-in burglaries.

It goes without saying that the police can not be everywhere all the time, so the diligence of neighbors watching their own homes and those of their neighbors and reporting to police any suspicious activities has led police to the successful arrest of many of those criminals who have been plaguing the area. One prime example was the action of one neighbor who heard and then saw a would-be burglar in the act of trying to break in the back door of a neighbor's garage. The residents were not home at the time, but the fact that the helpful neighbor called 911 immediately resulted in the suspect being chased down and arrested.

Police have reported that this particular individual apprehended was also suspected of being connected to at least a dozen or more break-ins in Meadowood and surrounding neighborhoods. Amazingly, with his arrest and a few others in the Greentree Neighborhood, again aided by neighbors who reported the incidents in real time, the number of break-in burglaries has dropped significantly for many weeks! Prior to this time, the number of area break-in burglaries averaged 10 or more per month.

I am not saying all crime incidents have ceased, but the numbers of all crimes, especially property crimes and violent incidents, have dropped since citizens have become the additional eyes and ears for the Madison Police Department (MPD). The diligent efforts of the MPD also deserves a great deal of credit for this turnaround. I would like to state that the Meadowood Neighborhood Association, (MNA), has been very supportive and was a catalyst for the development and growth of the neighborhood's Police Liaison Program, on the Nextdoor Meadowood website. It has allowed Merle and me to share information on what is going on related to crime, as well as how we can all protect ourselves from reported trends in area crimes.

I would encourage all of you, if you haven't already done so, consider signing up online for Nextdoor, by going to: https://nextdoor.com/neighborhood/meadowooddane--madison--wi/. It costs nothing to become a part of this very valuable social website which has grown exponentially, I believe, because of the emphasis that has been given to the crime and public safety initiatives on the site.

Merle and I pledge to continue our efforts so long as the MNA continues supporting us doing so! We have on-going access to police representatives and their informational resources which we will continue to share through this newsletter and the Nextdoor site. Thanks to all of you who have assisted us in our efforts. Enjoy the Summer and stay safe out there!




MOST Program Finder Article mostmadison.org

Apologies from the editor of the 'Meadoword' for not having the space to include all of Matt Phair's letter to 'Meadowood Neighbors' in the April issue. The following paragraph from that earlier letter is an important piece of news and especially relevant to our neighborhood...

Byrne Grant Initiative: As some of you probably know, the City received a planning grant from the US Dept. of Justice. The focus of the grant is to provide resources, by way of a full-time project manager and a part time researcher, in order to engage the community in writing a thorough plan, backed by evidence and data that lays out solutions and strategies for making our neighborhoods safer and more vibrant. The planning area is being referred to as the "Raymond Rd. corridor." The initiative is co-lead by Common Wealth Development and the Madison Police Department. At this stage, the project manager has been hired as has a professional researcher. The first task of the project manager is to engage the community and organize a steering committee of residents. It will be that group, led by the PM, who will have 18 months to write the plan and submit it to the DOJ to compete for a \$1 million implementation grant. I have met with the researcher (Kimberly Hassel, of UW-Milwaukee) and the newly hired project manager (Stephanie Bradley-Wilson). I am impressed with both of them and have encouraged them that the only way this initiative will be successful is if the work is truly done by residents and the end result genuinely reflects the wishes and desires of the neighborhoods involved.
