The New Year is a time to regroup, re-envision and consider future goals. At the Meadowood Neighborhood Association (MNA) board retreat in October, the board met to consider goals for the next several years and to set specific goals for 2017. These goals reflect the vision we have for Meadowood; a short summary is below.

We invite you to be an active participant in helping shape our neighborhood. Please volunteer to help with a neighborhood event and contribute your own ideas for our neighborhood by attending a board meeting or by contacting your area representative.

The Board's goals:

- Increase diversity at neighborhood events and on the MNA board to reflect our neighborhood.
 Regardless of elementary school area, profession, age, homeowner or renter, our neighborhood is strongest when all perspectives are included.
- Encourage more community involvement.
- Increase MNA membership and fill all MNA Board seats.
- Strengthen communication between the board and the neighborhood. Re-envision the MNA website and determine the best ways to communicate neighborhood activities to our members.
- Lay the groundwork to sponsor a specific project in Meadowood or a neighboring school.

Update on the Byrne Criminal Justice Innovation Project

The Byrne Criminal Justice Innovation (BCJI) project is for the Southwest Madison neighborhoods that includes the Meadowood, Prairie Hills, Greentree and Park Edge/Park Place/Waterleaf Apartment area. The project is an 18 month planning grant, obtained by the Madison Police Department in 2015 from the federal Department of Justice (DOJ). The purpose of the grant is to facilitate resident developed strategies that address deep drivers of crime for the area.

Community Breakfast Meeting

Over the past several months residents and stakeholders from the Raymond Road corridor have been meeting to identify strategies to address issues around safety and well-being in our southwest community for the Byrne Criminal Justice Innovation Grant. Information gathered from the sessions will be reviewed during a breakfast meeting hosted by Good Shepherd Church, 5701 Raymond Rd, on Saturday, January 21, from 8:30 AM until 11:30 AM.

The next phase of the planning process is to apply for an \$850,000 implementation grant from the Department of Justice in February 2017.

Ice Dams Can Be Costly

A few inches of snow, freezing temperatures and warm air leaking into your attic are a perfect combination for ice dams. What's an ice dam, and why should you be concerned if you have icicles hanging from your gutters?

Ice dams form when heat in the attic melts the snow on the roof and water runs down to the overhang and then refreezes. The ice starts to build up, holding water which can then flow back up the roof under the shingles. This often results in serious water damage to the ceiling and walls inside the home. Often, the damage can't be seen until it's too late, and repairs can be expensive.

Warm air leaking into your cold attic through attic bypasses (the small holes and paths by which heated air flows into the attic) is

> usually the culprit. Some sources include electrical boxes, exhaust fans, lighting fixtures including recessed lights and wiring penetrations and attic hatches/ entrances. These warm air bypasses have to be fixed first to eliminate the problem. A lack of ventilation and/or not enough insulation can add to the trouble.

> If you think you have a problem, your best bet is to have a home energy audit performed. An energy professional can do a blower door test to find the leaks and seal them. He also can tell you if you need more attic insulation or ventilation. Remember, this problem is not going to just go away. It will continue to happen year after year when conditions are right.

The small increase in county taxes allow us to maintain all basic services, continue working on keeping the lakes and rivers in the Dane County as clean as possible, and expanding our county parks and recreational trails.

The homeless day shelter is moving along with construction and is scheduled to open in the late summer / early fall.



construction does not get delayed like it did last year and we will hold him to his word. I am especially proud that the 2017 budget includes significant funding of a new and innovative violence prevention initiative, commonly known as the "15-point plan," that I worked very hard to get in place. It is the beginning of a truly collaborative process in which the City is partnering with community stakeholders to get at root causes of violence, especially among our young people.

The 2017 new year will see the continuation of the City's Racial Equity and Social Justice Initiative (RESJI); I will work with my colleagues to strengthen the commitment we have made to understand and break down historical barriers people of color face to gain opportunity and success in our city. As for our neighborhood in 2017, we will continue to align resources so that all families are safe, empowered and set up with opportunities to be successful. The areas that I will focus on in 2017 will be housing quality and affordability, access to employment and educational opportunities and youth violence prevention. There are a lot of resources already in place; with strategic alignment and a genuine commitment to community based solutions, we will continue to improve the conditions for all our neighbors!
